

**Jeans Day** - A Jeans Day will be held **Friday** for all students, faculty, and staff. Jeans day is not a “dress down” day but a day to wear blue-jean pants.

- Jeans **ARE TO BE BLUE-JEANS ... NO jeggings!**
- Jeans **ARE NOT** to be tattered, frayed, nor have holes (**NO** patches ... sewn, taped, etc.).
- Shirts are **NOT TO BE LOW-CUT, TIGHT, OR REVEALING.**
- Shirts are to be long enough to be tucked-in even if they are not (**ABSOLUTELY NO BARE MIDRIFFS!**)
- No skirts or dresses (unless you are wearing the regular navy blue skirt and tights).
- No pajama pants, flannel pants, wind pants, sweatpants, shorts, or capris.
- Socks must be worn.
- T-shirts/sweatshirts with writing or pictures referring to alcohol, drugs, music groups, or things which are contrary to the philosophy of the school are not allowed.
- No **CLOGS**, sandals, slippers, or “toed” shoes are allowed for safety reasons. Tennis shoes are acceptable.
- Students not wearing jean pants **MUST** be in dress code.

**Students who violate the jeans day rules will**

- receive a detention
- not be allowed to attend class until the violation is corrected.
- not be allowed to participate in the next jeans day.

Fourth period teachers will collect the money from each student who is not in **complete regular dress code**. Teachers will record the amount on the envelope. If a student does not have any money and is unable to borrow it, he/she must pay **double** the following school day. A student may come in ordinary, complete dress code and is not obligated to pay.
