Happy Easter! Have a great spring break! When we return on May 2, we will enter into not only the final chapters and projects in the classrooms but also into the traditional rituals of May.

The freshmen had a great retreat and generously shared their talents and energy in meaningful service projects throughout the city. They then processed the experience in small groups and prayer. We applaud their efforts and also the planning and supervision provided by campus ministry, by volunteer parents, by on-site supervisors, teachers, and student leaders.

The juniors and seniors are invited to the Prom on May 7. After the dinner and dance at Crowne Plaza, students are invited to participate in the Post-Prom at the Racquet Club. Kudos and thanks to the chaperones at the prom and at the Post-Prom. We hope students will enjoy the event and be safe. The program is during school time and, due to limited seating, participation is limited to students and faculty.

Registration for summer school is due the first week in May. Please turn in forms and payment as soon as possible. Summer school is not required, but it offers an opportunity for incoming freshmen to become familiar with SHG and to begin connecting with SHG classmates. It also opens their schedules to taking a few electives for their junior and senior years.

Several of the Catholic grade schools host an event for the 8<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade graduates. We allow the students to attend with parent permission. There is an expectation that students will drive directly to school when it is over.

AP tests will begin on May 2. If your student invests time in studying during spring break, please encourage their efforts.

Graduation on May 22 will include a presentation of honors, the celebration of Mass, the SHG Hall of Fame Induction, and the conferral of diplomas. All invited guests must have a ticket for admission. We wish the SHG Class of 2011 many joys, successes, and blessings. May they be good Christians, life-long learners, and great citizens!

Due to the five snow days, Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors will not be finished with exams until May 26. This date was published more than fifteen months ago, so we expect students to comply with the scheduled exam times.

We are in the process of revising/developing freshman orientation. There will be several components that will require parent participation. Please continue to check daily announcements and watch for these coming events.

We will continue to keep you informed during the summer. We will use School Reach, which is an all-call to parent phone numbers. We will also use email access to parents through RenWeb.

We have a small group of parents who are making plans to revive the Parent Network, which is a parent organization dedicated to connecting parents to work together on topics that directly impact their students. Many of you are familiar with the support of the faculty lunch, post-prom, and Mother/Daughter Brunch. They will also address parent involvement in working against underage drinking and drug use. Other topics for holistic parenting will also be presented.

#### *Sports Physicals*

Mark your calendars for **Monday, May 2**. Sports physicals for current Sacred Heart-Griffin athletes will be offered **free of charge** in the study hall (#213) of East Campus beginning at **3:30 p.m.** for both boys and girls. Over the past years, many of the physicians and nurses of our community have provided these physicals to SHG at no cost. **REMINDER**, IHSA policy states that all students participating in athletics must have a current (less than a year old) physical on file in the school's main office **PRIOR** to the beginning of a sports season. All athletes must pick up a medical history form from the Common's office. This form is to be completed and signed by both the student and parent/guardian. Students **MUST** bring it with them the afternoon of the physical. **IF THE ATHLETE DOES NOT HAVE A COMPLETED HISTORY FORM, NO PHYSICAL WILL BE GIVEN!** Incoming freshmen school physicals will suffice for this requirement as long as it is completed **BEFORE** tryouts and summer practices.

#### *Summer School, 2011*

The last day to register for summer school classes without paying an extra late fee of \$10 per class is **Tuesday, May 3**. All students are assigned to classes strictly according to when their registration was received in the office ... first come, first serve basis. (All registrations were numbered as they were received.) Some student's classes may be "flip-flopped" from their original choice. Students will **NOT** receive a confirmation letter. Your cancelled check or receipt of cash will be the confirmation of registration.

Summer School classes begin **Tuesday, May 31** and continue through **Friday, July 1**. All students should meet in the Commons on the first day. There will be class lists and room numbers for each class. Because of the

condensed and intense format of summer school, absence from class is very detrimental. **MORE THAN THREE DAYS ABSENCE, FOR WHATEVER REASON, IN A FIVE WEEK COURSE MEANS LOSS OF CREDIT FOR THE COURSE.** If the student is unable to attend summer school on any given day, the parent/guardian will need to call in his/her absence to the main office (787-1595) by 8:00 a.m. Please send a note the following day to verify the absence.

There is a relaxed "dress code" in the summer. Shorts are acceptable as long as they are of modest length; tank tops or shirts which show bare midriff are NOT ALLOWED; t-shirts/sweatshirts with writing or pictures referring to alcohol, drugs, music groups, or things which are contrary to the philosophy of the school are NOT ALLOWED; and hats are NOT ALLOWED other than in outside P.E. classes. Gym shoes are REQUIRED for P.E. The building will be air conditioned which will make a difference in the choice of apparel. ### **COLLEGE ADVISEMENT FOR JUNIORS**

This summer is a perfect time to make strides in the college search. A college planning seminar was held in January for the juniors. For those juniors not having a study hall, an additional seminar was scheduled before school on March 30. A copy of our "College Planning Guide" can be found on the SHG website at [www.shg.org](http://www.shg.org). Click on the "Students" tab and then the "College Planning" link. Much of the information to be covered in the seminars can be found in this document. In addition, there will be another college seminar offered to all juniors during school on May 10 and 11 during their study halls. Some of the topics covered will include: how to proceed with their search during the summer, an update about Naviance and its use, and time for questions. Please feel free to contact our college counselor, Mrs. Heckman, or your student's guidance counselor if you would like further assistance in the college search.

### **NAVIANCE- FAMILY CONNECTION ... WHAT IS IT?**

This is our third year of using Naviance, an interactive college advising system. We have given codes to the junior class so that they can access the program from home as well as during school hours. Family Connection is a comprehensive website that you and your SHG student can use to help in making decisions about courses, colleges, and careers. You and your student will be able to build a resume, manage timelines and deadlines for colleges, compare GPA and standardized test scores for admittance at a prospective university, and see when colleges are sending representatives to our school. In addition, Family Connection lets us share information with your student about upcoming meetings and events through email notification.

We also have codes for each of the junior parents to access Naviance. Included with the codes will be a primer of how to access all the different programs that are available to us. Please contact Mrs. Heckman if you would like to set up an individual appointment to go over the college planning process that was discussed with your student.

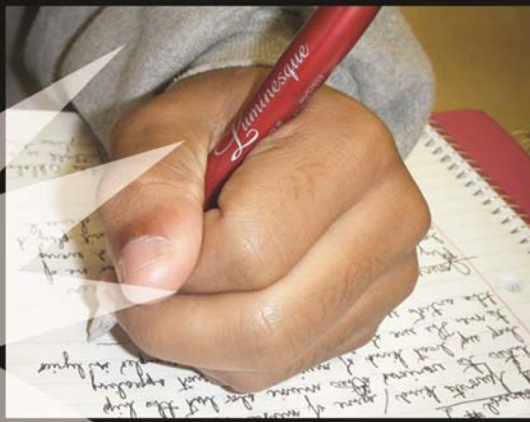
